MAIN PURPOSE OF JOB:

- To contribute to the rehabilitation of service users attending the Yeldall Manor rehabilitation programme.
- To support core Yeldall Manor staff while undertaking evening duties.
- To facilitate access to external activities by Yeldall Manor residents.
- To ensure adherence to the agreed Vision, Mission and Values of the organisation, including ensuring that the Christian ethos and culture is developed and maintained.



MAIN TASKS OF THE JOB:

- To support the main core staff member on duty during the evening in implementing the Yeldall Manor programme, including:
 - Being available to make phone calls for residents, checking what they are entitled to according to their stage on the programme.
 - Give and sign out medication when required by residents (if you have completed your competency assessment regarding medication).
 - Fill in the Duty Checklist at the given times.
 - Answer all phone calls if the Lodge duty resident is not present or available.
 - Open up the tuck shop for the resident Tuck Man at the allocated time and check he is carrying out his responsibility correctly.
- To support residents on the First-Stage programme by interacting with them and encouraging them in their recovery and spiritual growth.
- To support First-Stage residents as they participate in in-house or external faith-focused meetings (Alpha, Freedom in Christ, etc.).
- To undertake driving duties to enable First-Stage residents to access external opportunities (e.g. 12-step groups in the local community, courses and events at local churches, other recovery focused events, etc.).

OTHER DUTIES:

- To participate fully in the spiritual life of the project.
- To uphold at all times the Christian Values and Ethos of Yeldall.
- To ensure that Yeldall Diversity (Equal Opportunities) Policy is adhered to at all times in respect of both clients and co-workers.
- To attend management supervision sessions, in-house and external training courses as required.
- Any other task, as directed, commensurate with the grade of the post.

Working conditions (e.g. hours of work, any travelling required etc):

- This is a part-time, occasional post.
- You will be expected to work flexible hours according to the requirements of the role.
- Payment to cover Annual Leave and Bank Holiday allowance is accrued on the basis of hours worked.
